Against All Odds

"If I get an operation I will be like a brand new Tiaviniaina."

Tiaviniaina and her family have endured a lot since she was born nine years ago with a cleft lip. They live in northern Madagascar, farming on other people's land so they can eat – but the work is rarely more than twice a week.

Before Tiaviniaina was born, no one in the community had seen a cleft condition. "They believe she is carrying a curse that will hit the entire village," says Lucien, Tiaviniaina's father. Lucien and his wife Germaine love their daughter. "We chose the name (Tiaviniaina) because it means 'she who will be loved', to show others that we love our daughter," says Germaine.

But neighbours wouldn't accept the small family. Over the years they did everything to drive them out. First, they tried to persuade them to voluntarily leave the house they rented. When that failed they turned to the homeowner to throw them out. "They said: 'Get out of here, you will bring bad luck to the neighbourhood'. Some of them tried to persuade us to kill our baby, but we obviously didn't want to," Lucien says seriously.

Lucien and Germaine tried to keep their spirits up, along with Tiaviniaina's. Some children wouldn't play with her and other children's parents chased her away. One day she came home and showed her parents something she'd been given

to eat by some other children. It looked sweet and tasty, but she hadn't tasted it yet. Lucien was horrified and very upset. He knew what she held in her little hand was so poisonous she would have died if she had eaten it.

When Tiaviniaina was four, a visit to the hospital revealed that surgery was possible to correct her cleft lip. But the cost made it far out of reach. A few years later, Germaine heard a radio ad from Operation Smile promoting a mission in Majunga. Germaine and Tiaviniaina made the long journey to the mission site, but Tiaviniaina was too malnourished to receive surgery. The next mission was different – thanks to a nutrition and food workshop given at the previous mission. Tiaviniaina finally received the free surgery she and her parents had desperately hoped for... surgery that gave her a new smile.

"I can't stop looking at her," Lucien says, his eyes sparkling. Tiaviniaina, thinking about her future, says, "I want to go to school and study. I want to be a mom and I want to get married." Thank you for helping transform Tiaviniaina's life.

FOREVER SMILES CLUB

Surviving a difficult childhood, Wayne explains why he included Operation Smile in his will.



As a baby, Wayne Bumstead's cleft palate caused him frequent choking episodes. His parents feared that he might die, and kept him close by their bedside at night. "My parents even attached bells to my arms to wake them up so they could help me," he recalls.

Wayne received his cleft surgery as a young child, and was treated for other

conditions including difficulties with his hearing and severe scoliosis – a curve in his spine. He grew up, got a good job and married the love of his life, a police dispatcher.

Years later, while watching an Operation Smile television program, Wayne learned what happened to people with untreated cleft conditions in low-income countries. His childhood memories came flooding back, and Wayne became a donor.

He enjoyed seeing the impact of his support on the lives of children with cleft conditions and, like a growing number of partners, decided to include Operation Smile Canada in his will through a charitable bequest. That made him eligible to join the Forever Smiles Club, a special group for supporters like Wayne who make a lasting gift.

Asked why he chose to remember Operation Smile in his will, Wayne replied: "Well, when I see their faces that the medical volunteers have healed with such care..." Wayne's voice trails off, and he takes a moment to collect himself before continuing. "Operation Smile is a beacon of hope for humanity," he reflects thoughtfully.

Julissa was shocked and saddened when she discovered her daughter Mercedes had a cleft lip and cleft palate. Her cleft conditions had not shown up on the pre-natal ultrasounds. There was no family history, and neither she nor her husband Luis had ever seen anyone with a cleft condition before. Little Mercedes was fitted with a baby obturator – a device to help her with feeding by partially closing her cleft palate. At five-months, an Operation Smile volunteer medical team in Bolivia provided free surgery to Mercedes to repair her cleft lip. Six months later, Mercedes showed off her new smile, just before another surgery to repair her cleft palate. You ensure these miracles of smiles keep happening.

Throughout their journey to Puebla, Clara prayed Emanuel would be selected for surgery. After a two-hour bus ride, Clara finally got the news she had been waiting for. After the free and safe surgery, Clara couldn't believe her eyes seeing her baby boy's new smile. Several months later, Clara returned to Operation Smile Mexico where precious Emanuel received a second operation to repair his cleft palate.





KIDS HELPING KIDS SMILE

Rob Aguiar is passionate about inspiring his students to make a positive difference in the world.

He started this by renaming his classroom GLIMPSE INTO THE LIFE OF A CHILD and referring to his students as GLIMPSE kids. Aguiar, a grade three teacher, used the word "glimpse" because he wants to encourage his students to learn about compassion by peering into the lives of others. This way they can learn to celebrate diversity between families, cultures, and communities. "These kids are our future," Aguiar says. "My goal is to empower them to believe that they have a voice that can and should be heard."

After seeing Operation Smile Canada on television prior to the last school year, Aguiar selected us as the recipient of his classes' fundraising and advocacy campaigns. He believed our efforts as a charity mirrored the important social lessons that he was trying to teach his students and that it "seemed to fit perfectly." The partnership helps the students see first-hand how their efforts can "make a difference in the lives of children, their families, and entire communities."

Last year, the GLIMPSE kids raised enough for over 15 new smiles by collaborating on a songbook celebrating self-love and selling it to members of their community. And this year, they've already more than doubled the smiles with a variety of different campaigns.
