Efren's life transformed!

Operation Smile is celebrating new smiles and the bright futures you have helped deliver to children like Efren, who have been patiently waiting for the care they so deserve.

As a young boy, Efren didn't have big dreams for his future. He was born with a cleft lip and cleft palate, a condition that surprised his unsuspecting parents. He was lonely and treated like an outcast.

His family was his world, and they lived on one of the many islands in the Philippines. Their financial situation limited the options available for the cleft surgeries and care Efren would need. His cleft condition made it difficult for him to communicate and be understood by his peers. When other kids bullied him, he fought back and often came home from school in tears.

At the age of 10, Efren's family discovered and contacted Operation Smile in the Philippines. Efren underwent a comprehensive health check, and soon, surgery became a reality. In 2014, he received his first cleft surgery to repair his lip. A year passed, and Efren was thriving. In 2015, he received his cleft palate surgery. All this was made possible by partners like YOU!

"I'm so happy now, I can't express how I feel. It was so painful to see how sad and upset he was coming home from school," said Efren Sr.

Today, Efren is 18 years old, and his future looks completely different. Speaking more clearly, Efren has gained so much confidence and has found his place in his new

neighbourhood, attends school and has a group of friends to hang out with in his spare time.


YOU have helped transform his life for the better!

The Champions Program: Education and Transformation

In the next 15 years, 2.2 million more surgeons, anesthetists and obstetricians will be required to ensure that 80% of the world's population can access safe surgical treatment.

For 40 years, Operation Smile has been working to mitigate the shortage of skilled healthcare providers and build an effective capacity at the local level. Our ongoing commitment to investing in a global network of medical volunteers helped shape our Champions program.

The Champions program creates opportunities for our medical volunteers to partner with medical leaders who are on the front lines of cleft surgery and care in their countries. Increasing access to cleft surgery and care means addressing the gaps in the health system that create barriers for patients in need of care. Our Champions allow us to engage with strategic hospital partners, academic institutions and governments and effectively advocate for more equitable access to cleft care.

Every surgical table also serves as an education table. Our global medical volunteers are trained in plastic surgery,

anesthesiology, surgical instrumentation, pediatrics, psychology, speech therapy, clinical photography, medical records, dentistry, nursing and more!

Our Champions are mentors, thought leaders and advocates for the children we serve, and **YOU are their CHAMPION** too.

Celebrating Our Champions In Colombia

The first Champions program in Colombia was held in February 2023, in which 18 experts in different specialties from Canada, the USA, Italy, Mexico, Brazil, Nicaragua, Peru and Venezuela came to Colombia to work with local Champions. They helped strengthen Riohacha's district hospital and trained more medical volunteers in the northeast region of Colombia, where many of our patients live. During the program, 50 children with cleft lips and cleft palates received medical assessments and cleft surgery.
