Surgical Care, **Closer to Home**

While the journey to a new smile does not start or end with surgery, it is a major milestone for a child born with a cleft condition. Operation Smile's short-term surgical programs ensure patients receive essential surgical and comprehensive care closer to where they live, reducing the financial and emotional burden for families.

While a single cleft lip surgery can still cost as little as \$240 (like Tommy in Madagascar), children often face more complex surgeries. In this past fiscal year, 4,774 surgeries were performed on 4,126 unique surgical patients at an average cost per surgery of just over \$1,000.

Care Centres are vital to our program offerings in the countries where we work. The centres provide specialty consultations and services in nutrition, speech therapy, oral care, psychosocial care and other pre- and post-operative care programs.

Building Sustainable Healthcare Through Education

Empowering local health professionals through training and education creates surgical solutions that last. We celebrate that 85% of our volunteers reside in the low- and middle-income countries served by Operation Smile.

In the fiscal year 2024, Canada invested \$1,810,051 in direct education & training costs.



Operation Smile Academy

Operation Smile Academy is a competencybased e-learning and remote mentorship service for cleft care professionals. The platform has allowed medical learners in low- and middle-income countries around the globe to access high quality education and training materials since 2021, when pandemic regulations made it difficult to offer learning opportunities in person.

Specialty Courses & Certifications

Operation Smile has offered American Heart Association (AHA) courses to their volunteers around the world for decades. Volunteers have the options to register for Basic Life Support (BLS), Advanced Cardiovascular Life Support (ACLS) and Pediatric Advanced Life Support (PALS). In fiscal year 2024, Operation Smile Canada set a target to support over 27,700 unique surgical and non-surgical patients. This target was successfully exceeded by global teams, with the organization providing consultations to **31,350** unique patients in the **18** countries we support.


13.2% **Over our initial goal**
